Author Assignment of Intellectual Property Rights to BMJ Publishing Group Limited (“BMJ Group”)

To be agreed to by the corresponding author or guarantor on behalf of all authors, (“Corresponding Author”)*

In consideration of the BMJ Group considering to publish the case report submitted (“the Contribution”) in its online product currently called BMJ Case Reports (“BMJ Case Reports ”), and granting certain rights of use should the case report be published, certain rights are required to be assigned as follows:

i) the entire copyright and all rights in nature of copyright and all other intellectual property rights, whether vested, contingent or in future throughout the world in the Contribution; and any diagrams, photographs and/or illustrative material which are owned by the Corresponding Author and other authors included within the Contribution (including all updates and other material written for the BMJ Group), and for the avoidance of doubt this includes all editions and subsidiary rights for the full term of copyright and all renewals and extensions thereof and to licence for publication, the Contribution in whole and in part all editions, forms and media in the English language and in any translations, without limitation; and

ii) all rights of action and all other rights of whatever nature in the Contribution and any diagrams, photographs and/or illustrative material which are owned by the Contributor, whether known or in the future created to which the Contributor is now or may at any time after the date of this Agreement be entitled by virtue of or pursuant to any of the laws in force in any part of the world.

In circumstances where the Corresponding Author or any author is an employee acting in the course of their employment in producing the Contribution, the Corresponding Author warrants on behalf of itself and all authors that it has obtained all necessary written releases required to assign the rights herein from their employer(s) with respect to the Contribution.

The Corresponding Author irrevocably and unconditionally waives all moral rights in respect of the Contribution to which he/she may now or at any time in the future be entitled under any relevant legislation and has secured such a waiver from all other authors to the Contribution. The Corresponding Author declares this/these waiver(s) shall operate in favour of the BMJ Group.

Reversion of Rights

If the Contribution is not published in BMJ Case Reports or any other BMJ Group product, within 12 months of final acceptance by the BMJ Group, (or as otherwise agreed), the assignment herein shall automatically terminate and all rights shall revert to the copyright owner. The BMJ Group may keep a copy of the Contribution as a record (including via any contractor).

Changes and Updating

The author(s) acknowledge and accept that BMJ Group may make additional changes to the Contribution as considered necessary in accordance with standard editorial processes. The Corresponding Author will usually see proofs of their articles and every effort will be made to consult with the Corresponding Author if substantial alterations are made.

The BMJ Group may approach the Corresponding Author to assist with updating the Contribution but is not obliged to do so and reserves its full editorial control over Contribution, including removal in whole or part of the Contribution and allowing third parties to amend or alter the Contribution. Any such agreed updating services from the Corresponding Author however shall be performed according to such specifications & timing which shall be mutually acceptable to both parties and evidenced in writing and shall otherwise be governed by the terms of this Agreement unless expressly indicated otherwise.

Rights Granted to Authors of the Contribution

In return for the assignment of intellectual property rights the Corresponding Authors shall have the following rights for non-Commercial Use (unless otherwise stated)* of the Contribution:

1. The right to reproduce a reasonable number (no more than 100) of print copies of the final Contribution, by copying or downloading from the BMJ Group website, for personal use and to send copies to colleagues in print or electronic form provided no fee is charged and this is not done on a systematic basis (which includes via mass e-mailings).

2. The right to include the Contribution in a compilation for classroom use (course packs) to be distributed free of charge (other than for direct photocopying costs) to students at the Contributor’s institution or to be stored in digital format in data rooms for access by students as part of their course work and for in house training programmes of the Contributor(s)’s employer or at seminars or conferences subject to a limit of 100 copies.

3. The right to publish with the necessary acknowledgement all or part of the material from the published Contribution in a book, essay, position paper, or other non peer reviewed publication authored or edited by the Contributor(s) (which may be a Commercial Use). This does not apply to multiple Contributions, for which permission from the BMJ Group must be sought.

4. The right to use selected figures and tables (of which the author or his employer owns or has licensed) and selected text (up to 250 words) from the Contribution for incorporation within another work published in print or digital format by a third party, so long as credit is given to the BMJ Group and use of the parts of the Contribution (which may be a Commercial Use).
5. The uses that the BMJ Group will allow third party users of the BMJ Case Reports to make will be as set out on the BMJ Case Reports website.
6. All other rights not expressly granted by the BMJ Group are reserved.

* “**Commercial Use**” includes:

- copying or downloading of documents, or linking to such postings, for further redistribution, sale or licensing, for a fee;
- copying, downloading or posting by a site or service that incorporates advertising with such content;
- the inclusion or incorporation of the document content in other works or services (other than normal quotations with an appropriate citation) that is then available for sale or licensing, for a fee;
- use of documents or document content (other than normal quotations with appropriate situation) by for-profit organisations for promotional purposes, whether for a fee or otherwise.
- use for the purposes of monetary reward by means of sale, resale, license, loan, transfer or other form of commercial exploitation.

Author warranties

The author(s) warrant that:

- i) they are the sole author(s) of the Contribution which is an original work;
- ii) the whole or a substantial part of the Contribution has not previously been published;
- iii) they or their employers are the copyright owners of the Contribution;
- iv) to the best of their knowledge that the Contribution does not contain anything which is libellous, illegal or infringes any third party’s copyright or other rights;
- v) it has obtained in writing all necessary patient consents for anything submitted within the Contribution, and supplied this to the BMJ Group;
- vi) should any third party rights be included within the Contribution, these have been notified to the BMJ Group and all necessary permission for publication within BMJ Case Reports have been obtained by the Contributor or BMJ Group as agreed.

General

Nothing contained in this Agreement should constitute or shall be construed as constituting a partnership or contract of employment between the parties or their associates and for the avoidance of doubt the Corresponding Author is supplying the Contribution as an independent contractor, under a contract for services.

Alterations to this Agreement are only valid if they are recorded in writing and signed by both parties.

In the event that any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid, the remainder of the provisions shall continue in full force and effect.

Law and Jurisdiction

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of England without regard to the principles of conflicts of law. The parties hereto submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.
